FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Cold and flu season is upon us and already I received an anonymous note asking me to ban handshaking and communion from the cup for the duration. While this may seem like a sensible restriction to impose, I find two major problems with the recommendation.

First, the banning would be enacted from on high. This certainly would alleviate any decision a member of the congregation would have to make. Therein lies the problem. From the time of Vatican II onward, the Church has asked us to take personal responsibility for many of the decisions that were formerly made for us. Recall the mandate to refrain from eating meat on all Fridays during the year. The Church didn't do away with the need for personal penitential practice. Rather the Church asked us to make the decision as to what our penitential practice would be outside of the Fridays during Lent. The Church respects the dignity of all baptized members of he Church and trusts each to make good decisions.

The second major problem is that the example Jesus left for us is not a "command from on high mentality". Jesus brought people to a point of decision and did not mandate which way the choice should go. We see that aspect over and over again in the way he treated people and in the parables he told. Jesus did not come to be served, but to serve.

Because of these two problems I am not going to ban either the sign of peace or communion from the cup. I will ask each person to make a wise choice. If you are sick, please refrain from a handshake at the sign of peace and communion from the cup. If you are well, please continue to enjoy each. I trust that you will make the right decision.
