FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Pope Francis has written another Apostolic Exhortation, this one called *Gaudate et Exsultate* (Rejoice and Be Glad). Many may have already been aware of its publication from reading about it in the newspaper or hearing about it on a newscast. But hearing about it and reading it for yourselves are two different things. Hearing about it means that you are trusting the person who wrote the report to have read it themselves and understood what they have read. Reading it for yourselves means that you access the Vatican website(www.vatican.va) and read it for yourselves.

The title comes from a line in the Beatitudes "Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven." (Mt 5:12) The exhortation is a reflection on the universal call to holiness. We are all called to be holy!

The titles of the individual chapters: The Call to Holiness, Two Subtle Enemies of Holiness, In the Light of the Master, Signs of Holiness in Today's World, Spiritual Combat, Vigilance and Discernment, give us insight to what the Holy Father sees going on in the world today. There are pitfalls to true holiness in the chapter entitled "Two Subtle Enemies of Holiness." There is a reflection on the Beatitudes in the chapter entitled "In the Light of the Master." What the Pope hopes to accomplish is simply to take a practical look into holiness in our day. This goal, while seeming like it would be an easy read, does challenge us in our understanding of what it means to be holy. I encourage each of you to take the time to visit the Vatican website and read this Apostolic Exhortation **Fr. Rick**
