Movie Matinee

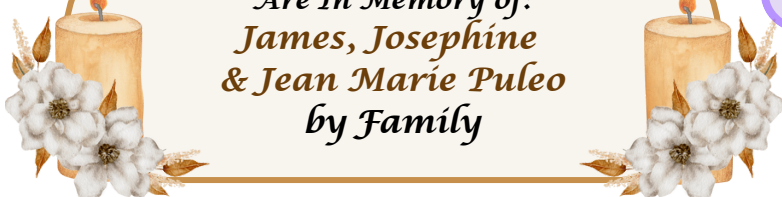

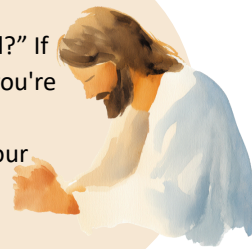
